

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
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General presentation of the strategic directions of the FDP Association – Protagonists in education

1. Preventing school dropout through sport

Social Sports School, a program implemented in Romania since 2013, through which we aim at the inclusion of children and young people through sports, but also at the prevention of school dropout among children from vulnerable backgrounds. The activities are based on the methodology developed by the Real Madrid Foundation, being aligned under **7 basic values**: equality, autonomy, team spirit, motivation, self-esteem, health and respect. **vvmotivație, stimă de sine, sănătate și respect.**



3. Support for vulnerable communities – Ludești Impact

The „**IMPACT Ludești**” project was born after an analysis at the level of Ludești, Dâmbovița County. Since a number of needs were identified in the local Roma community, together with our partner, the City Hall of Ludești, we wanted to be the ones that make an impact in the community.

We use integrated services through which we aim to improve education, health, the degree of employment on the labor market and the empowerment of people in need. We also support the improvement of the living conditions within the community.

The partnership concluded within the project, between teachers, parents, students, public institutions and the community, helps us to make a change in the lives of children and young people.



2. School and social inclusion of children with special educational needs (SEN)

Day center for counseling and support for parents and children - WONDER Center.

It is a licensed social service that offers free counseling and specialized support to children with special educational needs (SEN) and their parents. In a friendly space that encourages trust, openness, creativity, more than 60 children benefit from free individual and group therapy, non-formal education activities, socialization and recreation, and their parents learn how to understand and help their children better in terms of the ailments they suffer from.

4. Social Housing

We ensure support and decent living conditions for people with disabilities who are at risk, until it is overcome.



5. International Cooperation Support for Ukraine

Our interventions have been, since the first day, oriented towards providing emergency aid, but also to identify the best medium and long-term solutions for refugees who have expressed their intention to stay in Romania for a long period. Together with partners from the NGO sector, along with local and central authorities, we have made helping refugees from Ukraine a strategic priority for the programs of the FDP Protagonists in Education Association in 2022.



Foreword

“Dear children, parents, partners and friends,

With gratitude and involvement, together we went through a year with challenges, with lessons, with many beautiful projects, but also with achievements that we put our heart into and that gave meaning to our effort to build a better world for those who are struggling. We see every day the positive impact we have on the lives of vulnerable families in our community. We strongly believe in the value and potential of each individual and through all programs, we strive to give them the chance to push their limits.

These results are a testament to the passion and professionalism of the FDP team, who work every day to make a difference in the lives of children and their families.

However, our work does not end here, we are committed to continuing this path, to build a more inclusive world, a world where everyone feels loved, accepted, valued.

Every donation, every hour of volunteering and every message of encouragement gave us wings to stay true to our mission. You are the ones who made us believe in our dream and keep fighting for it.

The FDP Association - Protagonists in Education (FDP) was founded in 1996 by Italian and Romanian volunteers, with the support of the Italian organization AVSI.

01. JANUARY

- We launch the Ludești Impact project, Dâmbovița county.

- We are launching the project **“WONDER-land**, a model of access to education for all children”, a project financed by United Way Romania.



02. FEBRUARY

February 24th – **The start of the war in Ukraine.**

The FDP is involved in the emergency aid provided to Ukrainian refugees.



03. MARCH

- We mark 26 years of FDP activity in Romania.

- We are developing a network of 10 transit centers to provide **support to Ukrainian refugees** who fled the conflict zone with financial support provided by AVSI (Italy), Kaufland Romania, AVON.

04. APRIL

We launch the **„Power from all”** project, financed by the Association for Romanian Community Relations (ARC), through the “Hope for Ukraine” fund with the support of the Federation of Non-Governmental Organizations for Children (FONPC).

We are establishing the Isaccea HUB – a humanitarian hub serving people affected by the war on Ukrainian territory in the Odessa region.



08. JULY-AUGUST

We organize **5 camps at the sea** with 150 Ukrainian mothers and children, together with Romanian children.



05. MAY

We initiate partnerships with “Plan International” and **UNICEF** with the aim of running long-term projects addressed to Ukrainian refugees.



09. SEPTEMBER

Teambuilding FDP team.



10. OCTOBER

We celebrate Education Day through a series of sports activities in the IOR Park.



12. DECEMBER

Running the Christmas campaign „**Santa comes you every year, never to them!**” 400 children from Bucharest and Dâmbovița received gifts from the volunteers of partner companies.



11. NOVEMBER

“We mark the Day of the Poor, **a support action for 30 families** from the Ludești community, Dâmbovița County.

“We organize Thanksgiving Day with the participation of partners and 80 refugees from Ukraine, supported by us in Bucharest.



07. JULY

10 children from the Sports Social School program participated in Copa Alma, together with representatives of the other sports schools supported by the **Real Madrid Foundation** from all over Europe, being awarded the **#Respect** trophy.



06. JUNE

- We celebrate Children’s Day and **mark 9 years since the establishment of the Social Sports School** in Romania.

- We are developing HUB Isaccea with financial support from CESAL Spain, Valencia, IBO – Emilia-Romagna Region.

Social Sports School

Wonder Daycare Center

Sports Social School

It is one of the longest-running programs of the FDP Association - Protagonists in Education, being implemented since 2013 in partnership with the Real Madrid Foundation. The aim is to facilitate social inclusion through sport and prevent disadvantaged children from dropping out of school. In carrying out activities with children we follow the methodology developed by the Real Madrid Foundation and **promote 7 essential values** for our beneficiaries: **equality, autonomy, team spirit, motivation, self-esteem, health and respect.**

What activities do we carry out with the beneficiaries of the Sports School?

- ✓ Weekly sports training (football, athletics, dance)
- ✓ Socio-educational and remedial activities
- ✓ Counseling children and parents
- ✓ Participation in sports events, visits to museums, theater
- ✓ Creative workshops, recreational games, music studios, ping-pong, cinema, dance, story clubs, boat rides
- ✓ Mixed kid-adult friendly matches, treasure hunt, mime

RESULTS IN 2022:

0% School dropout among beneficiaries

- ✓ 90 children enrolled in the 2022-2023 season
- ✓ +600 trainings (football, multisports, dance)
- ✓ Numerous socio-educational visits
- ✓ Participation in the annual Copa Alma competition, organized with children from sports social schools from all over the world
- ✓ Participation in friendly matches between children and mixed children-adults (employees of companies)
- ✓ Participation as spectators in important sports matches.





Within the program, an exchange of experience organized in Madrid with other children/coaches of sports social schools from other countries was carried out, as well as a training for coaches involved in the project based on the methodology developed by the Real Madrid Foundation.

Day Center for counseling and support for parents and children – WONDER Center



The WONDER Day Center, the first center in Bucharest that offers free counseling and support to children with special educational needs (SEN), but also to their parents, continued to support over 60 children from disadvantaged backgrounds, who are diagnosed with specific learning disorders, ADHD, behavioral and affective disorders, etc.

With the help of specific therapies they take part in weekly in the WONDER center, children are making remarkable progress. In 2022 alone, they benefited, with the help of the association's team of therapists and speech therapists, from over 4,000 hours of therapy.

The support we offer within the center is personalized to the needs of each child and includes activities such as:

- ✓ Therapeutic workshops and specific therapies. Each child benefits from a needs assessment according to which specific therapies are determined, with a frequency established by each specialist: speech therapy, psychomotricity, psychological and behavioral counseling, educational therapy for cognitive stimulation, art therapy
- ✓ Non-formal education activities
- ✓ Learning through play
- ✓ Educational support: homework preparation club



The operation of the WONDER day center and the support provided to beneficiaries diagnosed with SEN would not have been possible in 2022 without the financial support of our partners: ROSS Foundation, United Way, Renovabis and the support received from the authorities through Law 34/1998.





NATIONALLY FUNDED PROJECTS

“Sport for all” Project supported by Decathlon



Together with Decathlon Romania, we developed in 2022 “Sport for all”, a sports project addressed to children from disadvantaged social environments, from communities on the outskirts of Bucharest, in the Giulești Sârbi, Faur Republica, Colentina and Rahova neighborhoods.

The project addressed a number of 120 children, including a number of 25 children diagnosed or suspected of special educational needs.



We promoted the active participation of children in sports activities such as athletics, modern dance, street dance, football. Through these activities we offered our beneficiaries more opportunities to interact, to be integrated into different social groups and to make new friends, doubling sports activities with socio-educational actions: visits to the museum, the Botanical Garden, the theater, etc.

Children’s participation in sports training contributes to emotional balance and regulation, but also to the development and promotion of attitudes, beliefs, moral feelings and prosocial behaviors (fair play, respect, collaboration, equality, team spirit, friendship).

Education platform **Eduaces.ro** in support of school inclusion




FDP Association – Protagonists in Education launched in April 2021 the www.eduaces.ro platform, a support for education professionals who want to adapt learning to the specific needs of children with special educational needs (SEN).

The **EduacCES** project offers:

- ✔ A digital center of learning resources adapted to children with SEN (worksheets, manuals, research, lesson models, interactive games organized according to diagnosis and class), made available free of charge to education professionals
- ✔ A space that encourages the exchange of experience and the development of an inclusive community of professionals
- ✔ Online support provided by EduacCES specialists (psychologists, pedagogues also specialized on psychology, psychotherapists, etc.) to teachers who face challenges in the classroom
- ✔ Materials available in Romanian, English, Hungarian and German to ensure national coverage also for children with learning difficulties belonging to minorities

RESULTS IN 2022:

- ✔ **16.000** users visited the platform **eduaces.ro**
- ✔ **372.250** educational resources were downloaded for free
- ✔ **196** education professionals have created an account on the platform
- ✔ **+1.500** educational resources made available free of charge to the public
- ✔ **+100** games and non-formal activities made available to users
- ✔ Third prize - Digital Innovation in CSR (Romanian CSR Awards); Gold Recognition - Community Index; Nomination Civil Society Gala 2022



The development of the eduaces.ro platform was possible thanks to the financial support provided by the Vodafone Romania Foundation, in partnership with the Bucharest Municipality Center for Educational Resources and Assistance (BMCERA), the digital solution being designed by Code For Romania.

“WONDER-land, a model of access to education for all children” Project supported by United Way Romania

With the support of United Way Romania, in partnership with 7 schools in Bucharest (Secondary School no. 143, Secondary School no. 124, Mircea Sântimbreanu Secondary School, Dimitrie Bolintineanu Theoretical High School, Princess Margarita Secondary School, Secondary School no. 128 and Secondary School no. 116), we carried out between January 1 and December 31, 2022 the project “WONDER-land, a model of access to education for all children”.

The project addressed a group of **50 children** with special educational needs (SEN) and 35 their parents. They benefited from therapeutic support services (evaluation, speech therapy, counseling, psychotherapy, psychomotricity), sports activities, ecological and environmental protection activities, as well as socio-educational visits in the community.

Because the integration of children with SEN can only be done through activities carried out in the community they belong to, we have developed the activities so that the beneficiaries of the project are alongside their colleagues in the activities carried out.



The project aimed to prevent school dropout and eliminate barriers by supporting the socio-educational integration of children with learning difficulties in mainstream education. This was achieved by developing an integrated inclusion model within the WONDER Day Center.



Thus, **240 children** from partner schools participated, together with students with SEN, in non-formal activities (Community treasure hunting) based on VR images, games and group discussions, and **60 teachers** from partner schools were informed about SEN issues, by organizing courses and offering models of adapted educational materials.

The inclusion model implemented within the project aimed to develop a community of specialists who promote the inclusion of children with SEN, who could get informed and exchange experience through the eduaces.ro platform.

Thus, the **WONDER Day Center** has become a landmark and an example of good practices both in Bucharest and at national level.

“Power from all”

Project supported by the Association for Community Relations Romania (ACR), through the fund “Hope for Ukraine”, with the support of the Federation of Non-Governmental Organizations for Children (FNGOFC)

The project took place between April and June 2022 and aimed to provide support for refugees, immediately after their entry into Romania. She addressed a group of 4 mothers and 17 children accommodated in the GDSACP District 3 transit center.

Through actions to quickly support basic needs: providing food, medical services, ensuring safe accommodation, clothing and games for children, transport, support for employing adults, their integration into social and educational levels was pursued.



„Pepcolandia 2022”

Program financed by PEPCO Romania and implemented by CONCORDIA Humanitarian Organization

During the summer holidays, in June - August 2022, children from the Wonder Center and their parents participated in a series of educational and relaxing activities within the PEPCOLANDIA project.



The “Parents’ Café” was the perfect opportunity for parents to share their experiences, joys and worries with other parents and Wonder Center specialists. In parallel, at “Island of Families” we organized non-formal activities in the park or at the headquarters of the FDP Association – Protagonists in Education for parents and children.



The workshops attended by both parents and children enjoyed great popularity, being the moment when the little ones spent quality time with their mothers, while creating decorative objects (photo frame in which they immortalized the moment of the workshop), napkin technique on glass glasses, painted T-shirts and made wire modeling.



Vulnerable communities

Food Bank Partnership

Our association makes it a priority to support vulnerable communities. And in 2022 we were where it was needed, providing first aid support and providing essentials to survival. Education is important, but it is essential to meet basic needs such as daily food provision.



In 2022 we continued the partnership started in 2020 with the Food Bank and strengthened already in 2021. We are very happy about this partnership and the help we can offer to our beneficiaries. We offered weekly food products to 50 families from outskirts of Bucharest.

IMPACT Ludești

FDP Association – Protagonists in Education runs between January 2022 and December 2024 the project “IMPACT Ludești”, funded by the EEA Grants.

The overall objective of the project is to improve the social inclusion of Roma in Ludești, Dâmbovița, through integrated education, health, employment, empowerment services, but also support for improving housing conditions. Special attention is paid to Roma children and youth, especially Roma girls, and the project aims to create a solid local partnership between teachers, parents, pupils, public institutions and the community.

200 children from primary and secondary education participate in remedial and non-formal education activities, and **120 young people** benefit from professional counseling services and participate in qualification courses in relevant trades requested by employers in the area.



The project also provides health education services for a number of **350 children and youth**, as well as empowerment and capacity building programs for 25 Roma youth and 15 Roma experts from the community.

International cooperation

The intervention of the FDP Association – Protagonists in Education after the outbreak of the war was channeled in two essential directions for a sustainable and safe intervention for our beneficiaries:

1. Providing emergency aid for people fleeing war and arriving in Romania
2. Identifying and implementing medium and long-term solutions for refugees who wanted to stay in Romania



Support to Ukraine - Emergency aid

The emergency aid focused on covering basic needs (from food, hygiene products, beds to educational kits for children, blankets, socks, furniture and more), but also special needs (legal assistance, short-term accommodation, translator, emotional support, medical services).

People helped: over **16.000 refugees** were supported by providing basic food, clothing, hygiene kits, educational kits, cleaning equipment, medical and legal services, food coupons, emotional support, educational activities, language courses, Romanian.

With the beginning of the war in Ukraine, FDP Association - Protagonists in Education was involved in supporting the needs of people from Ukraine coming from the armed conflict zone on Romanian territory, developing a network with 10 transit centers near Siret and Suceava customs, near Isaccea, Giurgiulesti, Oancea customs in Galati, but also in Bucharest.

Support to Ukraine - Medium and long-term projects

In 2022 I stood by Ukrainian refugees, shared their grief and saw the constant search for hope and trust. We have witnessed their trauma and loss and have done our best to provide humanitarian and emotional support.

Internationally funded projects

Humanitarian aid for Ukrainians fleeing war

Duration: 14th of June 2022 - December 2022

Funders: IBO in collaboration with Emilia-Romagna region, AVSI Partner



Objectives:

- ✔ Supporting the Ukrainian population, victims of armed conflict and vulnerable local population (people with disabilities and their families, minors, displaced persons, refugees and conflict victims, large families, minors and adults in institutions, orphans, minors and adults with health problems, the elderly) through the provision of food, necessities and medicines.
- ✔ Mitigate the dramatic effects of war through recreational, educational and occupational activities on vulnerable people (disabled people and their families, minors, displaced persons, refugees and conflict wounded, large families, children and adults in institutions, orphans, children and adults with health problems, the elderly) through the provision of food, basic necessities and medicines.



Results:

- ✔ More than **50 children** left without parents in the Volokhta orphanage received basic necessities
- ✔ Supporting Ukrainian refugees with **323 personal hygiene kitspersonală**



Isaccea HUB

Warehouse for the collection and distribution of goods to the population on Ukraine's territory affected by the armed conflict.



Duration: April 2022 – 2023


Funders: IBO in collaboration with the Emilia Romagna Region, Partner AVSI Italy, Generalitat Valenciana (Standing Committee for Humanitarian Action), Agència Catalana de Cooperació al Desenvolupament (ACCD) and funds raised by the CESAL Emergency Campaign (Spain) in favour of people affected by conflict.

Objectives:

Organize a HUB, a space for storage, preparation and transfer of food and non-food goods to reach the conflict-affected population in Ukraine.

Results:

- ✔ 800 trucks full of canned food, milk, pasta, oil, cereals, flour, medicines, hygiene products, clothes, etc. were unloaded and distributed in Ukraine, in the regions of Odessa, Nikolaev, Herson
- ✔ Over 10,000 people supported across Ukraine
- ✔ The involvement of Ukraine refugees in Hub activities



Humanitarian assistance

for people fleeing the armed conflict in Ukraine and seeking refuge in the city of Galati and for affected people remaining in Odessa district, Ukraine



Duration: 1st of June 2022 – 28th of February 2023

Funders: Agència Catalana de Cooperació al Desenvolupament (ACCD) and funds raised by the CESAL emergency campaign (Spain) for people affected by conflict.

Objectives:

- ✓ Supporting basic services (non-food items, hygiene kits and current bills) for Ukrainian families transiting the ProVeritas Galati Centre (reception capacity of up to 150 people).
- ✓ Shipment of food and other commodities (stored in Isaccea HUB) to the population of Odessa district, Ukraine, between September 2022 and February 2023.

Results:

- ✓ Support for over 300 refugees who have been sheltered in the transit center
- ✓ Support for more than 5,000 war-affected people in Ukraine during winter



Safety without borders

Supporting mothers and children coming from the Ukrainian conflict area for ensuring decent living conditions during their stay in Romania

Duration: June – December 2022

Funder: UNICEF



Objectives:

- ✓ Safety without borders - supporting mothers and children coming from the conflict zone in Ukraine and ensuring decent living conditions during their stay in Romania
- ✓ Zero tolerance of sexual abuse and violence against children.

Results:

- ✓ 745 people, parents or children guardians, benefited from information and health promotion services
- ✓ 593 adults received informational materials on which discussions were based
- ✓ 773 people received hygiene kits
- ✓ 2 transit centers were equipped with sanitary facilities (including for people with disabilities)
- ✓ 2 dining areas have been set up in 2 transit centers in Suceava
- ✓ Kairos Association FDP staff and FARA Foundation staff provided information on medical services, legal services and counselling/psychological support
- ✓ 773 refugees in transit received information materials, emotional support and counselling in accordance with their needs
- ✓ 284 children (and their caretakers) received access to mental health and psychosocial support
- ✓ 5 child-friendly spaces have been set up, facilitating recreational activities in transit centers
- ✓ In the Suceava Center a room for mothers with small children has been set-up (diaper changing area, breastfeeding, games for the little ones)
- ✓ 773 children and adults benefited from awareness-raising activities to prevent social exploitation and abuse (SEA)

Objectives:

- ✓ Ensuring basic needs, access to mental health services and psychosocial support for families coming from the conflict zone.

Results:

- ✓ 3745 people affected by the crisis in Ukraine were protected from violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation
- ✓ 405 people accessed mental health or psychosocial support services (MHPSS) in protection programs
- ✓ 3745 people benefited from psychosocial support services
- ✓ 269 people (in Bucharest, Bușteni, Sinaia, Suceava) were supported with rent through the governmental program 50/20
- ✓ 5 summer camps with participation of more than 150 people (mothers, Ukrainian and Romanian children)






Bank interest and exchange rate differences
